The Lower Red River Watershed Management Board met on July 23, 1981 at 9:30 a.m. at the Agricultural Research Center, University of Minnesota, Crookston, Mn.

Treasurers report as of July 23. 1981 was read and approved.

Leon Zueg, Engineer from McCombs - Knutson and Assoc. reported on what their firm has developed to date and then presented an Engineering and Planning Program for 1981 thru 1983.

The various phases and their estimated costs and possible funding was discussed.

Phase I - Prioritizing Criteria for Flood Control Projects and Updating of Project Evaluation

Phase III - Data Base Development Program	97,000.00

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After discussion, a motion by Manager Ward, seconded by Manager Brekken to fund the various Phases mentioned above in the following manner: Lower Red - 87,500.00 and L.G.M.R. - 87,500.00, duly passed. It will now be sent to L.C.M.R. for their consideration.

Manager Trangsrud reported on the investigation being conducted by McGombs -Knutson and Assoc, The first phase has been completed at a cost of \$17,720.00, which has been paid by the Roseau River Watershed District. Spraque Creek has been found to be the most feasible, but more engineering is needed. The estimated cost of Phase II by McCombs - Knutson and. Assoc. is \$11,410.00 and Phase III is \$10,590.00. Upon motion by Manager Ward, seconded by Manager Brekken to adopt the work plan presented by McCombs - Knutson and Assoc., duly passed. The necessary funding of \$11,410.00 for Phase II will be picked up by L.C.M.R. and the funding for Phase III of \$10,590,00 will be paid in the following manner: L.C.M.R. -\$8,450.00 and Lower Red - \$2,140.00.

A progress report from the Red Lake Watershed District was given by Charles Anderson, their engineer.

Schirrick Dam

It is located on the Black River and has a drainage area of 108 square miles. The heights of the dam would be 38 feet. Total storage capacity would be 6500 acre feet, with 100 ac./ft. being permanent; 3700 ac./ft. being gated; 1000 ac./ft. ungated and 1700 ac./ft. being freeboard storage. The permanent pool area would cover 20 acres and the flood pool would cover 400 acres. The estimated cost is \$900,000.00.

Upon motion by Manager Brekken, seconded by Manager Ward to move Schirrick Dam to Step II, duly passed.

Mr. Anderson also stated that the Red Lake Watershed District has prioritized the projects in the following manner.

No. 1 - Moose River No. 2 - Schirrick Dam The hearing on

Pine Lake is scheduled for Aug. 15, 1981.

He also stated that more gaging stations are to be set up and standardazed.
