Meeting: Lower Red River Watershed Management Board December 15, 1987

The Lower Red River Watershed Management Board met on December 15, 1987 at 9:30 a.m. at the Northland Lodge, Crookston, MN.

Minutes of the November 13, 1987 meeting were read and approved with corrections.

The Treasurers report was accepted as read.

Project Reports:

Red Lake Watershed District

#### RLWD Project #68

The RLWD presented the RLWD Project #68 for step one approval. The RLWD is developing a multi purpose project on the west boundary of the Red Lake Indian Reservation. The project will provide flood control, water supply for wild rice irrigation, and recreation, fisheries and wildlife benefits.

The project originated by a petition which called for construction of a channel connecting the Red Lake and Clearwater Rivers. The petitioners were landowners on the Red Lake River, who envisioned benefits due to diversion of floodwaters, and rice growers on the Clearwater Meeting: LRRWMB December 15, 1987 Page 2

River who envisioned benefits due to increased water supply for irrigation.

The Red Lake Tribal Council also passed a resolution requesting that the spoil be placed on the Reservation. This will provide a road grade and dike for impoundments along the diversion channel.

There would be a 5.5 mile long diversion channel, with a stop log control structure. There would be 4,500 acre feet of flood control storage. The stop log storage would be 2,250 acre feet.

The estimated cost of the project is \$1,400,000.00. Proposed funding was a request for \$700,000.00 from the State Flood Damage Reduction funds, and the remainder to be funded by the LRRWMB, the RLWD and by assessment to private lands.

Upon motion by Manager Person, seconded by Manager Ward to give Project #68 step one approval, duly carried.

Black River Project

The Black River Project is now completed and the lawsuit has been settled. The RLWD requested additional funds for the completion of the project. The additional amount requested is \$90,000.00, with the LRRWMBs' share being \$52,839.00 and the RLWDs' share being \$37,161.00.

Upon motion by Manager Wilkens, seconded by Manager Quern to pay the LRRWMB request of \$52,839.00, duly carried.

## Two Rivers Watershed District

### Juneberry Ridge

This is a project consisting of twelve separately cont rolled pools that can be individually managed for optimum flood control and wildlife benefits. Also four upstream impoundments are proposed to provide flood damage reduction upstream. It will have 100,000 acre feet of controllable storage and a total estimated cost of \$20,000,000.00

A request was made for a high priority for the Flood Damage Reduction Grant application for \$120,000.00 that would provide the necessary data to refine the concept design and update the cost estimates.

The following request for funding was offered:

Upon motion by Manager Erickson, seconded by Manager Ward for the LRRWMB to expend \$40,000.00 to help fund the preliminary study for concept design, duly carried.

A request was also made for the LRRWMB to give the project a preliminary statement of intent to support the entire project with financial assistance of \$2,000,000.00. It would be for the purpose of maintaining flexibility in pursuing sources of funding outside of the Minnesota grant program.

Upon motion by Manager Quern, seconded by Manager Wilkens to adopt a resolution stating that the LRRWMB endorses the concept of the Juneberry Project and anticipates to participate in funding up to \$2,000,000.00 if initial study of the project proves acceptable, like step one approval, duly carried.

## Middle River-Snake River Watershed District

## Angus-Oslo #4

The project is an off channel impoundment which would temporarily store floodwaters. It has 1,700 acre feet of gated storage with an estimated cost of \$530,000.00. This a step one submittal.

A secondary purpose of the project is for enhancement of wildlife habitat. It has 787 ac feet of gated storage with an estimated cost of \$300,000.00. This is a step one submittal.
